

Town of Odessa Proposition No. 1

Levy Lid Lift for Odessa Police Department and Law Enforcement Services

The Town Council has adopted Resolution No. 2024-08 concerning funding for the Odessa Police Department and Law Enforcement services. If approved, this proposition shall fund the Odessa Police Department and Law Enforcement services. This proposition authorizes a 2025 regular property tax rate increase from the 2024 approximate levy rate of \$2.55/\$1,000 of assessed value to a levy rate of \$3.375/\$1000 of assessed value, which is an estimated increase of \$0.825/1000 of assessed value. The 2025 levy amount shall be used to calculate subsequent levy limits. Should this proposition be:

Fire District No. 5 **Proposition No. 1**

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and **Emergency Medical Services**

The Board of Lincoln County Fire Protection District No. 5 adopted Resolution No. 2024-002 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District Operations. This proposition authorizes the District to establish its regular property tax levy at \$1.00 per \$1,000 of assessed value to be assessed in 2024 and collected in 2025. The funds will maintain and improve fire protection, emergency medical services and facilities, replace apparatus and equipment, and provide for firefighter safety. The maximum allowable levy in 2024 shall serve as the base for subsequent levy limitations as provided by chapter 84.55 RCW. Should this proposition be:

Fire District No. 8 **Proposition No. 1**

Property Tax Levy for Fire Protection and **Emergency Medical Services**

The Board of Lincoln County Fire Protection District No. 8 adopted Resolution No. 2024-115 concerning a proposition to maintain and adequately fund District operations. This proposition would finance fire protection and emergency medical services by establishing the District's regular property tax level in 2024 at an amount not to exceed \$1.25 per \$1,000.00 of assessed valuation and authorize setting the limit factor at 105% for each of the following five years.
